



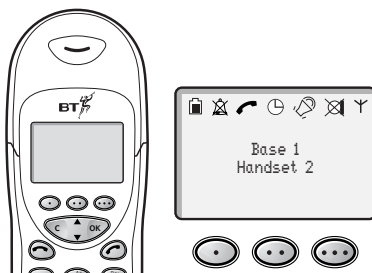
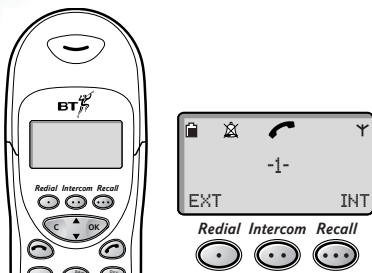
BT On-Air 1000 Classic and Executive Plus Handset

User Guide









This equipment is not designed for making emergency telephone calls when the power fails. Alternative arrangements should be made for access to emergency services.

This product is intended for registration to any base in the BT On-Air range. It may also be registered to other GAP compatible bases, with possible limited availability of some features.





Classic and Executive Plus Handset









Classic handset functions

-  **Up/Down.** Lets you move through the options and lists.
-  **Clear.**
-  **OK button.** To confirm settings.
-  **Redphone.** To end a call and turn the power off.
-  **Greenphone.** To answer a call and switch the power on.
-  **Redial button.** Lets you redial up to 20 of the last numbers called.
-  **Intercom.** Enables internal calls and call transfer between handsets.
-  **Recall.** For use with Switchboards and BT Select Services.








Classic handset display icons

-  **Battery.** Shows the status of the handset battery.
-  **Silent mode.** Displayed when the handset ringer has been switched off.
-  **In Use.** Shows that the handset is in use.
-  **In range.** Indicates that you are in range of the base station.
- EXT** **External Call.** Displayed during an external call.
- INT** **Internal (Intercom) Call.** Displayed during a call with another handset (an internal call).

Executive Plus handset functions

-  **Up/Down.** Lets you move through the menu options and list.
-  **Clear.**
-  **OK button.** To confirm settings.
-  **Redphone.** To end a call and turn the power off.
-  **Greenphone.** To answer a call and use the handsfree. Switch the power on.
-  **Option buttons.** Allows you to select an option when a function is displayed on the screen.

Executive Plus handset display icons

-  **Battery.** Shows the status of the handset battery.
-  **Silent mode.** Displayed when the handset ringer has been switched off.
-  **In Use.** Shows that the handset is in use.
-  **Alarm/Timer.** Indicates that alarm/timer has been set.
-  **Handsfree.** Indicates that you are in handsfree mode.
-  **Secrecy.** Press to mute the call so your caller cannot hear you.
-  **In range.** Indicates that you are in range of the base station.

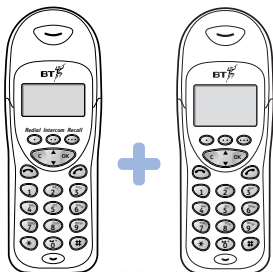

Safety information

General

Only use the power supply included with the product. Using an unauthorised power supply will invalidate your warranty and may damage the telephone. The item number for the mains power supply is 872101.

If Keyguard is active, it is still possible to make emergency calls to 999 and 112.

Do not open the handset or base station. This could expose you to high voltages or other risks. Contact the helpline for all repairs.

Radio signals transmitted between the handset and base may cause interference to hearing aids.

This product should not be used near emergency/intensive care medical equipment and should not be used by people with pacemakers.

Never dispose of batteries in a fire. There is a serious risk of explosion and/or the release of highly toxic chemicals.

Cleaning

Simply clean the handset and base station with a damp (not wet) cloth, or an antistatic wipe. Never use

household polish as this will damage the product. Never use a dry cloth as this may cause a static shock.

Environmental

Do not expose to direct sunlight.

The product may heat up when the batteries are being recharged. This is normal. However, we recommend that you do not place the product on antique/veneered wood to avoid damage.

Do not stand your product on carpets or other surfaces which generate fibres, or place it in locations preventing free flow of air over it's surfaces.

Do not submerge any part of your product in water and do not use it in damp or humid conditions, such as in bathrooms.

Do not expose your product to fire, explosive or other hazardous conditions.

There is a slight chance that your phone could be damaged by an electrical storm. We recommend that you unplug the power and telephone line cord for the duration of the storm.

Setting up

Please note that your handset must be registered to the base before use.

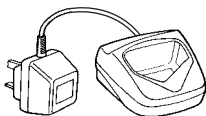
Plan the location

Situate your product close enough to the mains power sockets so that the cables will reach.

Make sure it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical products to avoid interference.

Do not situate the product in the bathroom or other humid areas.

1 Plug the power adaptor into the wall socket and switch on



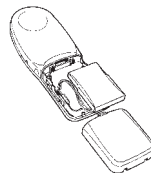
2 Install the battery in the handset and charge them for at least 16 hours


WARNING

Under no circumstances should non-rechargeable batteries be used. Only use the approved batteries. Using unapproved batteries will invalidate your warranty and may damage the telephone.

Fully discharging the batteries at least once a week will help them to last as long as possible. However, the charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, so reducing the talk/standby time of the handset. Eventually they will need to be replaced. New batteries can be obtained from any BT Shop or from the helpline on 0845 601 2476.

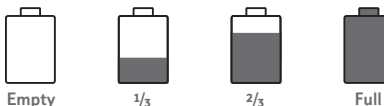
Slide off the battery cover and install the battery. Replace the battery cover.



When the battery has been charged for **at least 16 hours** the display will show the  symbol; you can then connect the telephone line cord to the base.

Battery low warning

If the handset battery symbol is empty and you hear warning beeps, you will need to recharge your handset before you can use it.



Battery performance

Your handset is supplied with NiMH batteries. These need to be initially charged continuously for 16 hours to reach full charge.

Note that the battery charge icon does not indicate the correct level when the batteries are first installed. The batteries must first be fully charged.

3 Changing your handset fascias

There are 3 removeable handset fascias to choose from. Simply slide the fascias off and replace with another.



Using a headset

For 'handsfree' operation and flexibility of your BT On-Air 1000 Executive Plus you can use compatible headsets. For a list of compatible headsets or to purchase one please call the BT On-Air Helpline on **0845 601 2476**

To connect your headset

Plug your compatible headset into the headset socket on the right-handside of the handset.



Note

Only use compatible headsets.

Registering your handset

Using additional handsets and bases

Up to six handsets can be registered and operated from any one base (on fax machines up to four handsets can be registered). This allows you to make internal calls between two handsets while a third is making an external call.

Each handset can also be registered on up to four bases.

Each additional handset you purchase must be registered to a base.


Registering Classic handsets


To register a Classic handset to a base station (if you have not changed System Code from 0000)

At the base:

 Press and hold down the button on the base until it starts to flash.

On the handset:


 Press the **OK** button.

 Press the **6** button.


The handset will now automatically register with the handset number.


To register a Classic handset to a base (if you have changed System Code from 0000)

At the base:


 Press and hold down the button on the base until it starts to flash.


On the handset:

 Press the **OK** button.

 Press the **9** button.

 Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select the base number ie. **1234**.

 Press the **OK** button.


 Enter the System Code.


Wait until the available handset numbers appear. ie. **234**. Then press the handset number that you want.

To de-register a Classic handset from the base

Intercom
 Press the **INTERCOM** button.

 Press the **OK** button.
F1 will appear on the display.

 Press the **3** button then the **3** button again.
---- will appear on the display.

 Enter the System Code. All registered handset numbers are displayed.

Enter the number of the handset to be de-registered. **Init = ok6** will appear on the de-registered handset.

 Press the **C** button twice.






Registering Executive Plus handsets

To register an Executive Plus handset to a base station (if you have not changed the System Code from 0000)

At the base:

 Press and hold down the **PAGE** button on the base until it starts to flash.

On the handset:













-  Use the **UP** button to scroll to **Base**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
The display will show **Register**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to **Automatic**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
The display will show **Searching for base**.

To register an Executive Plus handset to a base station (if you have changed the System Code from 0000)

At the base:

-  Press and hold down the **PAGE** button on the base until it starts to flash.














On the handset:

-  Use the **UP** button to scroll to **Base**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
The display will show **Register**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to select **Custom**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to the required base number.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
At this stage if you require you can edit the base name.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Enter the System Code using the keypad.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
The display will now flash **Searching for base**.
You will then see a list of the available handset numbers.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to the number you require.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.

Note

The number you save becomes the handset's name (ie. 'Handset 1').

To de-register an Executive Plus handset from the base

-  Press the **UP** button to scroll to the **Base** menu.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to **Base settings**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to **Handsets**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to **De-register**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Enter the System Code.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to the handset that you want to de-register.
Press **OK** to confirm.
-  This will time out and go back to idle.
- Or*
-  Press the **C** button until you get back to idle.
The handset is now de-registered.

Note




When planning to use a handset with more than one base, we recommend that you:

- Give a number to each base (from 1-4).
- Number each handset (from 1-6).
- Register your handset(s) at base 2 (and 3 & 4 if used) using the same internal number as at base 1.





Registering your handset to a BT DECTfax, BT DECTfax Plus or BT On-Air DECTf@x Plus.

The following instructions need to be carried out on your fax machine before you can register your handset.

On your BT DECTFax and BT DECTFax Plus:



-  Press the **OK** or **FUNCTION** button.
-  Press the **8** button twice.
-  Press the **OK** button or **FUNCTION** button.

Or on your BT On-Air DECTf@x Plus:

-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **6** button.
-  Press the **1** button.
-  Press the **OK** button.







To register a Classic handset to your DECTfax machine (if you have not changed the System Code from 0000)

On the Classic handset:

-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **6** button.
The handset will now register and take the lowest available handset number.





To register a Classic handset to more than one DECTfax machine or base station (or if you have changed your System Code from 0000)

On the Classic handset:

-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **9** button. The current base ID number will now appear on the display.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select a vacant base position _____.
-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Enter the System Code (default 0000).
-  Wait until the available handset numbers appear, i.e. 1234. Then on the handset keypad press the handset number that you want.

To register an Executive Plus handset to a DECTfax machine (if you have not changed the System Code from 0000)

On the Executive Plus handset:

-  Press the **UP** button to display 6 Base.
 -  Press **OK** to display 61 Register.
 -  Press **OK** to display 611 Automatic (and custom).
 -  Press **OK**.
- The handset will now register and take the lowest available handset number.

To register the Executive Plus handset on more than one DECTfax machine or base station (or if you have changed your System Code from 0000)

On the Executive Plus handset:

 Press the **UP** button to display 6 Base.

 Press **OK** to display 61 Register.


 Press **OK** to display 611 Automatic (and custom).

 Press **DOWN** button to highlight Custom.

 Press **OK**.

 Press **DOWN** button to highlight a vacant base position (1, 2, 3 or 4 _____).

 Press **OK** to display Base name: Base X_____.

 To change the base name press the **C** button to clear the existing name.

ABC Enter the name using the letters on the keypad.

 Press **OK** to display System code: _____

Enter the base code (default 0000).

 Press **OK**.

After a short delay the handset will display the available handset numbers.

 Press **DOWN** button to highlight the handset number you want.

 Press **OK**.

Using the Classic or Executive Plus Handset

To switch the handset power on and off



Press and hold the **GREEN PHONE** button to switch the handset on.



Press and hold the **RED PHONE** button to switch the handset off.

Making and ending calls

To make an external call



Press the **GREEN PHONE** button. The display shows the  symbol.



Dial the number.

Preparatory dialling

First enter the number to be dialled. The number is shown in the display. (If you make a mistake press **C** to remove the incorrect digit).



If you have entered the number correctly, press the **GREEN PHONE** button to dial the number.

Call timer

Your handset will automatically time the duration of all external calls. The handset display shows the call duration during your call.

To end a call



Press the **RED PHONE** button.

To receive an external call



Press the **GREEN PHONE** button to answer the call.


To adjust the earpiece volume

You can adjust the volume during a call.



Press the  button to increase the volume.



Press the  button to decrease the volume.

The display shows the current volume level.

To adjust the earpiece volume

You can adjust the volume during a call.




Press the  button to increase the volume.



Press the  button to decrease the volume.

The display shows the current volume level.

Note


The  symbol on your handset display indicates when you are in range of the base station. If the symbol disappears you are out of range and will need to move closer to the base station.

Secrecy

When on a call you can talk to someone in the same room, without your caller hearing.

To switch secrecy on/off



During a call, press the **C** button. **C** or  (depending on which handset you are using) will now flash to show it is in operation.



Press the **C** button again to resume your call.

Redial

The redial list can also incorporate incoming calls if you subscribe to BT's Caller Display.

Redial List



Press the **REDIAL** button. This will take you to the most recent number.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to the number you require.



Press the **GREEN PHONE** button to dial the number.

To delete all numbers shown in the redial list



Press **OK** then **4**, this will delete all numbers in the redial list.



The display will return to the idle state.

Redial list



Press and hold down the **GREEN PHONE** button.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button until the number you want is displayed.



Press the **GREEN PHONE** button to dial the number you want.

To delete numbers shown in the redial list

Enter the redial list



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button until the number you want to delete is displayed.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Use the **UP** and **DOWN** buttons until **Delete** or **Delete all** is displayed.



Press **OK** to confirm.

To copy numbers shown in the redial list to the directory

Enter the redial list.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button until the number you want to store in the memory is displayed.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button until **Dir store** is displayed.



Press **OK** to confirm.

ABC

Enter the name you want to store with the number by using the keypad.



Press **OK** to confirm.


Number memory


You can store up to 20 of your most frequently used numbers.

To store a number in the memory

- ▲ Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button until the display shows Mem...
- ▼ Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to the first available memory location.


Or

 Enter the number of the memory location and press **OK**.

 Use the keypad to enter the telephone number you wish to store.

 Press the **OK** button to confirm.


To dial a number from the memory

- ▲ Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to display the number you wish to dial.
-  Press the **GREEN PHONE** button to dial the number.

To edit and delete memory numbers


▲ Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to enter the memory number you wish to change.

Or

 Enter the number of the memory location and press **OK**.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

 Press the **C** button to clear and back space the numbers.

 Edit the entries using the number on the keypad.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

Name and number directory

You can store up to 50 of your most frequently used names and numbers.

To store a name and number in the directory

▼ Press the **DOWN** button until **Directory** is displayed.



Press **OK** to confirm.



▼ Use **DOWN** button to scroll to **New**.



Press **OK** to confirm.

ABC

Enter the name using the letters on the keypad.

Entering names

Use the keypad letters to enter names by using a long press of the button, i.e. if you press and hold the **2** button the following characters appear, T, U, V, t, u, v. For example, if you wish to store the name **TOM**:



To enter the letter **T**, press **8** and hold the cursor will automatically move to the right and display the next chosen letter.



To enter **O**, press **6** and hold.



To enter the **M**, press **6** and hold.



If you enter a digit incorrectly you can delete it by pressing the **C** button.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Enter the telephone number you want to store.



Press **OK** to confirm.

To dial a number from the directory



Press the **DOWN** button to select the **Directory**.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to **Find**.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to find the entry you want to dial.



Press the **GREEN PHONE** button to dial the number.

To edit and delete directory numbers



Press the **DOWN** button to select **Directory**.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to **Edit**.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to find the entry you want to amend.



Press **OK** to confirm.



Use the **C** button to delete numbers or letters.



Edit the entry using the numbers/letters on the keypad.



Press the **OK** button to store the new entry. The display will then show **Done**.

Internal calls

If you have multiple handsets registered to a base you can make internal calls between handsets.

To make an internal call to another handset

Intercom



Press the **INTERCOM** button.



Enter the number of the handset you want to call.

Or



Enter ***** if you want to call all the handsets



Press the **RED PHONE** button to end the call.

To make an internal call to another handset



Press the number of the handset you wish to dial i.e **1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6**.

Or



If you wish to call all handsets press *****



Press the **GREEN PHONE** button.



Press the **RED PHONE** button to end the call.

Transferring calls

You can transfer an external call to another handset registered to the base.

To transfer an external call between handsets

While on an external call:

Intercom



Press the **INTERCOM** button (you will hear a beep).



Enter the number of the handset to which you want to transfer the call.

If you wish you can talk to the other handset user first.



Press the **RED PHONE** button to transfer the call.

To transfer an external call between handsets

While on an external call:

OK



Press the **OK** button and Call hold 1 will be displayed.



Enter the number of the handset to which you want to transfer the call.



Press the **GREEN PHONE** button, then press the **RED PHONE** button. The call will be transferred. You can still talk on transfer if you want to.





Handset settings

Keypad beeps and tones





You can set your handset to beep or play a tone when you press a button on the keypad.

The BT On-Air Classic will come already set to ON.






Keypad beeps and tones volume

-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **5** button.
-  Use the **UP** and **DOWN** buttons.
-  Press **OK** to confirm the setting.

Ringer volume

-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **2** button.
-  Use the **UP** and **DOWN** buttons to select the volume you require.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.





Silent ring

-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **1** button.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select **1** for ringer active or **2** for silent ring.
- The display will show the  symbol to indicate a silent ring.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.





Note

The time is also automatically updated from the information provided by the network during an incoming call with caller display.

Ringer melody










-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **3** button.
-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to select the melody you require.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.

To view the date and time

-  Press the **INTERCOM** button.
-  Press the **OK** button.
-  Press the **1** button twice. The date will be displayed.
-  Press the **OK** button the time is displayed.

Keypad







To switch keypad on

-  Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to display **Set**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to display **Keypad**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
- The display shows 
-  Press the  button until the  appears in the box next to **On**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.

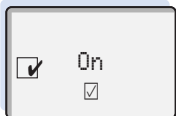
Note



If the keypad is active, the emergency numbers 999, 112 can still be dialled.

To switch keyguard off

-  Press the **STAR** button.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to display **Set**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to display **Keyboard**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.




The display shows



-  Press the **←** button until the ✓ is removed from the **On** box.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.

To use your handset when the keyguard is on







This temporarily switches off the keyguard allowing you to make a call. The keyguard will then re-activate after one minute.

-  Press the **STAR** button.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  If you receive an incoming call whilst the keyguard is on just press the **GREEN PHONE** button.

Economy mode

This feature enables you to extend the life of the battery by automatically switching the screen off if the phone has not been used for 30 seconds.





-  Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to enter the **Set** menu.

-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to **Economy mode**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Press the **←** button.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  To re-activate the screen press the **GREEN PHONE** button.


Keypad beeps and tones volume

You can set your handset to beep or play a tone when you press a button on the keypad.

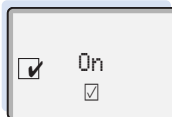
The BT On-Air Executive Plus will come already set to ON.

-  Press the **DOWN** button to enter the **Ringings and beeps** menu.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.
-  Use the **UP** button to scroll to **Beeps**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.

The display will show either **Keypad** or **Battery low**.

-  Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to highlight the one you wish to select then press the **OK** button to confirm.

The display will show



-  Press the **←** button to turn **ON** or **OFF**.
-  Press **OK** to confirm.

The display will then show **Done**.

To adjust ringer melody and volume

Choose from 10 different handset ringer melodies. Useful to determine which handset is ringing when you are using multiple handsets.

▼ Press the **DOWN** button to enter the **Ringing and beeps** menu.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

▼ Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to **Ringing**.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

▼ Select **External/Internal** or **Alarm** as required.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

▼ Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through the **Melody** options.


 Press **OK** to confirm.

You will then be asked to select the volume level.

▼ Use the **DOWN** button to scroll through and select the level you require.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

The display will then show **Done**.

If you require, the ringer can be switched off all together. The display will show  symbol to remind you that the ringer is off.

Vibrate

To switch Vibrate on and off

You can set your BT On-Air Executive Plus handset to vibrate and ring or vibrate only when someone calls you.

▼ Press the **DOWN** button to enter the **Ringing and beeps** menu.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

▼ Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to **Vibrate**.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

You can choose from **Vibrate and ring**, **Vibrate then ring**, **Vibrate disabled** or **Vibrate only**.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

If you wish to switch the vibrate off, follow the instructions above and choose **Vibrate disabled**.

Alarm clock

You can use your handset as an alarm clock. You must set the time before the alarm will work. The alarm will ring daily until the setting is turned off.

To set the alarm

▼ Press the **DOWN** button to enter the **Ringing and beeps** menu.


 Press **OK** to confirm.

▼ Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to **Alarm**.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

Set will be highlighted.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

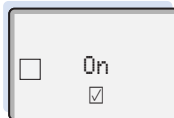
 Enter the time you want the alarm to go off at. (24 hour clock)




 Press **OK** to confirm.

▲ Use the **UP** or **DOWN** button to scroll to **Status**.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

The display shows











 Press the  button until the  appears in the box next to **On**.

 Press **OK** to confirm.

When the alarm is set  is displayed.




To turn the alarm off

- ▼ Press the **DOWN** button to enter the **Rings and beeps** menu.
 -  Press **OK** to confirm.
 - ▼ Use the **DOWN** button to scroll to **Alarm**.
 -  Press **OK** to confirm.
 - ▼ Use the **DOWN** button to select **Status**.
 -  Press **OK** to confirm.
- The display shows

-  Press the  button until the ✓ is removed from the **On** box.
 -  Press **OK** to confirm.














Handsfree

Handsfree allows you to talk to your caller without holding the handset.

To use handsfree

- During a call you can switch to handsfree mode.
-  Whilst on a call press the **GREEN PHONE** button.
- When handsfree is active you see the  symbol flashing.
-  To switch handsfree off, press the **GREEN PHONE** button again.

Timer

- ▼ You can use your handset to set a reminder alarm which will activate after a period of time of your choice.
 - ▼ Press the **DOWN** button to select **Rings and beeps**.
 -  Press **OK**.
 -  Press the **UP** button to select **Timer**.
 -  Press **OK**.
 -  Press **OK** again to select **Set**.
